TripleC are disabled-led throughout their company, from their board members to their focus group members.



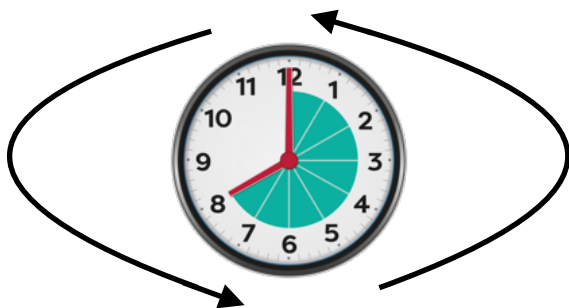
They work across the UK.
